

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Why a "PIRATE" Romeo and Juliet?

Well I have to credit my kid, Moss, who came up with that one. But I loved the idea for a few reasons.

The Capulets and Montagues could have been merchant rivals which were prominent in Italy during the Renaissance period. The conflicts during the Golden Age of Piracy also had a commercial component. It might be speculation, but perhaps there were violent conflicts in the port cities of the Caribbean in addition to those at sea, for the same reasons we see conflicts between families in Italy throughout this period.

Also, although some speculate the tale of Romeo and Juliet took place much earlier, Shakespeare himself lived and wrote during the Golden Age Of Piracy (from roughly 1550 to 1650). It is likely that he actually portrayed the story on stage as contemporary with his own time, as he often did with other works. So, we are changing the place, but not necessarily the period.

In addition, there is a lot of great "swashbuckling" in the play, and how easy it is to imagine that happening between the pirates and sailors of the Caribbean. And how fun it is to play it out on stage!

Finally, there is a strong linguistic connection with - -

Shakespeare's Original Pronunciation (OP)

Fairly recent research has given us a pretty good approximation of what Shakespeare's players would have sounded like on stage. It is very close to a West Country dialect (Example: Hagrid from the Harry Potter films) which we most often think of when we think of Pirate speech. The connection originated with Robert Newton, who played Long John Silver in the 1950 film "Treasure Island," because he actually had a thick West Country accent.

There was a full production in Shakespeare's OP at the Old Globe in the West End of London. And if you would like to hear what it sounded like check out the video promo at our website at ihsdrama.com. I think you will agree it sounds like "Pirate." For further information there are lots of great videos about Shakespeare's OP on YouTube.

We hope you enjoy our re-imagining of this most famous of tragic romances and thank you for taking a chance on "Romeo and Juliet of the Caribbean."
