

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I am very excited for you all to see this production of my favorite Shakespeare play, A Midsummer Night's Dream. This is my 4th production of the play and my 2nd time directing it. It is a very special play indeed.

It was the first Shakespeare play I saw live, and I credit it with starting a lifelong appreciation for the Bard. Midsummer's is often the doorway to Shakespeare for many, possibly the most accessible in terms of the language in Shakespeare's plays.

Shakespeare borrows from several different mythologies to create the world of the Fairies, and his conception of it is the basis for most of our modern understanding of fairy behavior.

Seeing a similarity between Hippie culture and Fairy culture, I thought it would be fun to set the play in a late 1960s / early 1970s. I had a lot of fun setting the music for between the scenes, and I know our costumers and stagecraft class had fun working in this period as well.

I think A Midsummer Night's Dream is probably Shakepeare's funniest comedy, and certainly his best written. In spite of an anachronistic Greece, with harsh laws for disobedient daughters, the play seems unified within itself, and sews up all its loose ends nicely with the performing of the most hilarious "play-within-a-play" ever written.

We hope you enjoy this colorful romp into our mystical forest/park, and let this be your gateway drug to Shakespeare, if you are not already addicted.
